A record 730 VIPs and industry guests - including Australian of the Year Dylan Alcott gathered for the awards extravaganza, held at Campbell's Cove, Sydney Harbour for the first time.

Mr Alcott took part in a QandA telling the crowd of the importance of accessibility in hospitality venues.

The prestigious Chef of the Year award on the accommodation side went to **Paul Griffiths**, **QT Melbourne** Victoria, meanwhile, **Anthony Fullerton**, **The Gem Hotel**, NSW took home the honours for the general division.

**Peninsula Hotel**, SA took home top honours for Best Bar Presentation and Service in a metropolitan area.
